



# Quarantine Fund Interim Report | July 2022

The Quarantine Fund was a rapid community based system that provided temporary aid of up to \$1,290 to agricultural workers who undertook self-quarantining while seeking medical assistance because of a possible COVID-19 exposure.

*The fund was exhausted in 2022.*

## Amount Disbursed



**\$14,517,905**

Relief delivered by the Oregon Worker Quarantine Fund to those exposed to COVID-19 and who practiced self-quarantine throughout Oregon's immigrant communities



**\$1,289**

Average aid disbursed to Oregon's immigrant community.

## Number of Recipients Who Received Aid

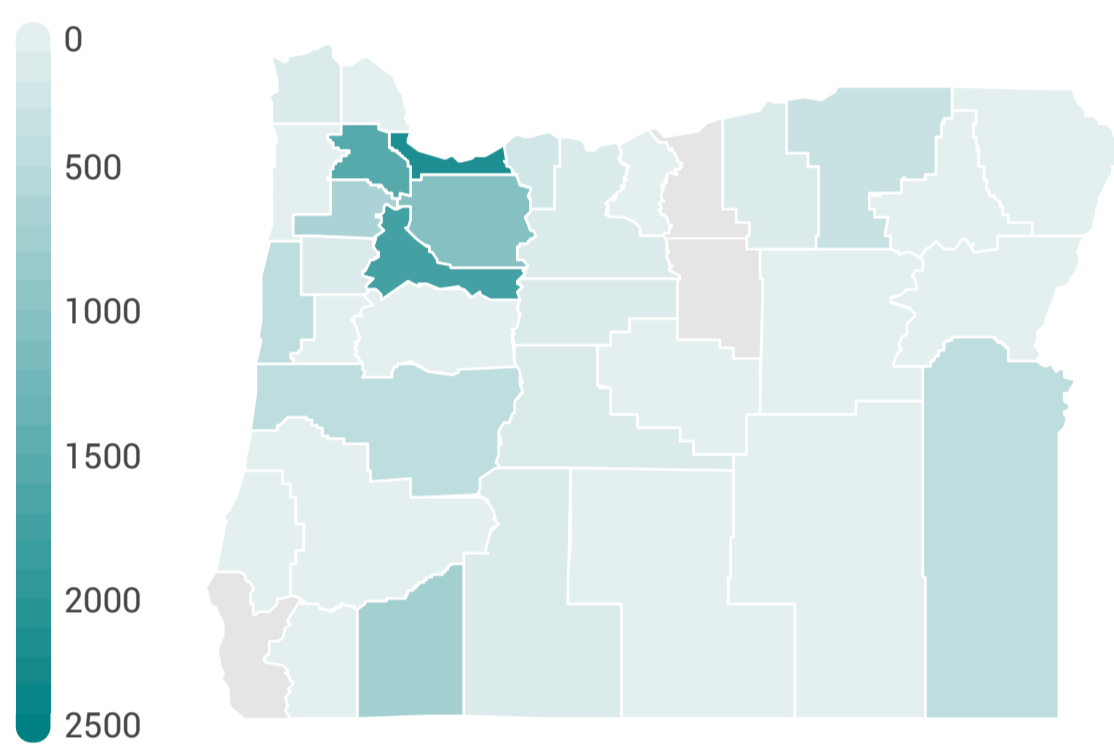

Oregonian immigrant families served by the OWQF ranged in size from single-person households to large families.

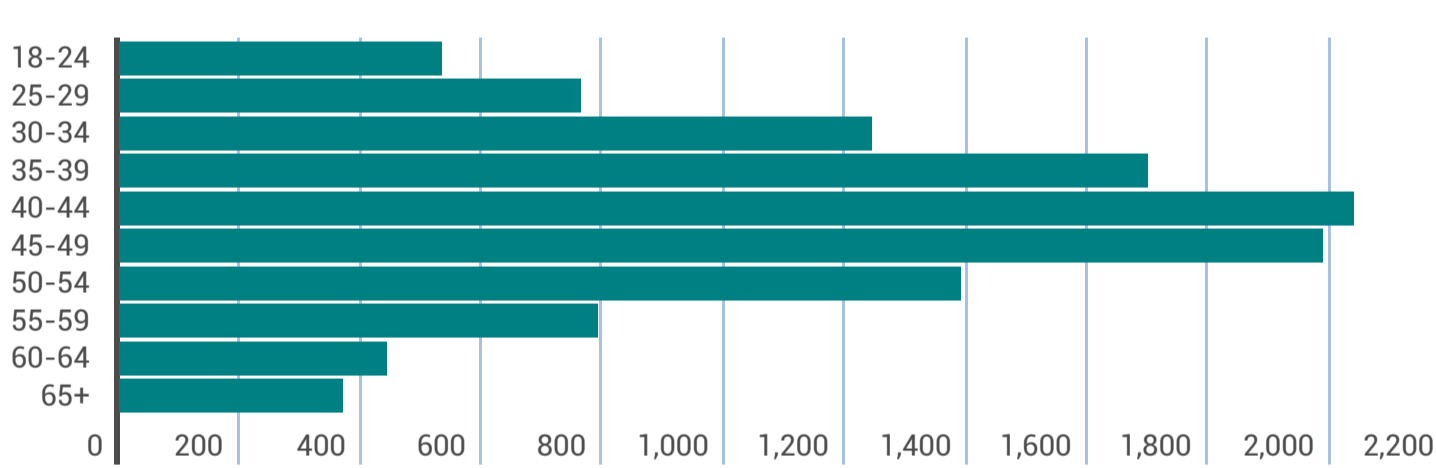


80% of OWQF recipients had at least 1 dependent minor child

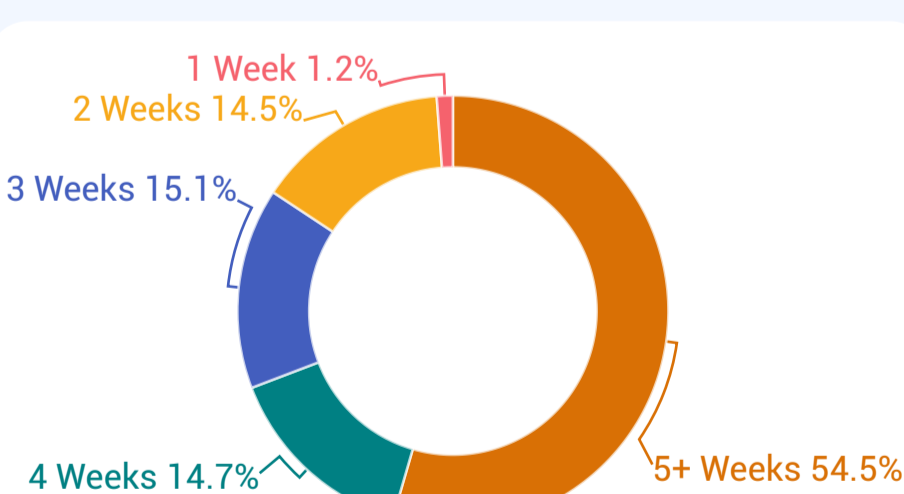

## Weeks of Hardship of OWQF Recipients



At the time of applying for relief, 54% of applicants indicated having 5 or more weeks of hardship as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
