



Relief Fund Interim Report | Oct. 2022

More than 100 community partners have come together to create the Oregon Worker Relief Fund, a rapid community-based system that provides temporary financial support to Oregonians who have been excluded from other safety net programs during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Amount Disbursed

\$92,572,438
OWRF has delivered over **\$92.5 million** in disaster relief throughout Oregon's immigrant communities.

\$67,980,128
First-time applicants received over **\$67.9 million** in disaster relief assistance.

\$24,592,310
Second-round applicants received over **\$24.5 million** in disaster relief assistance after having been approved as first-time applicants.

\$1,926
Average aid disbursed to Oregon's immigrant community.

Number of Recipients Who Received Aid

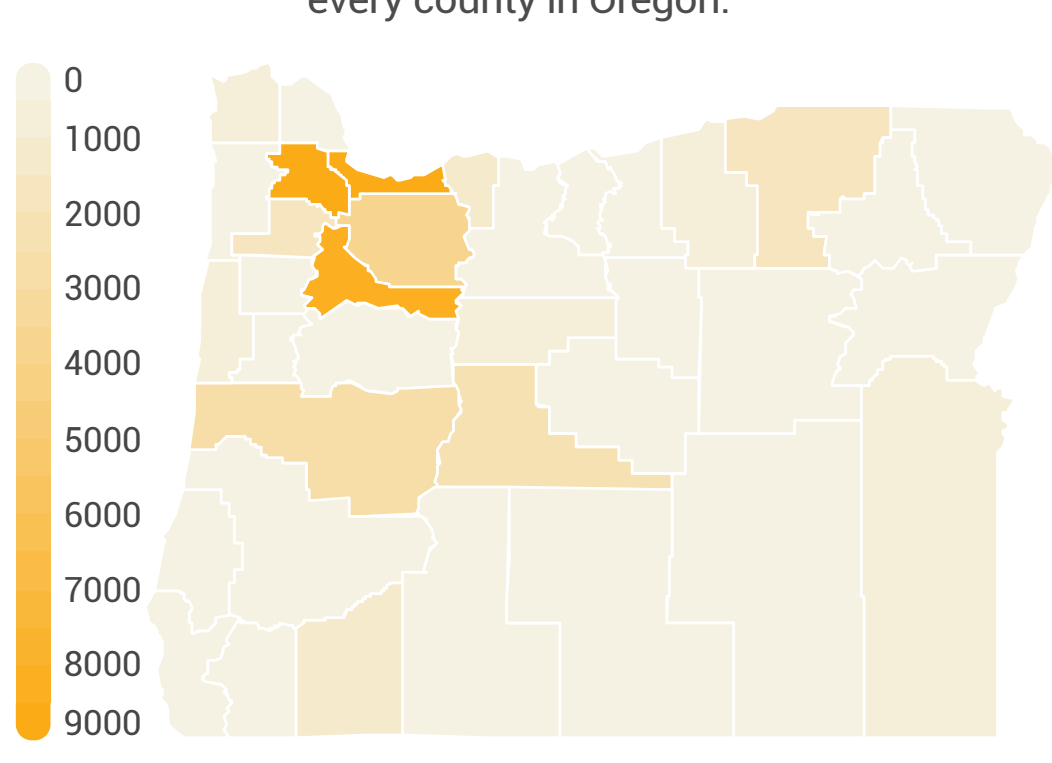
50,744 Total Individuals

OWRF's presence in Oregon is significant. OWRF has provided financial relief in every county in Oregon.



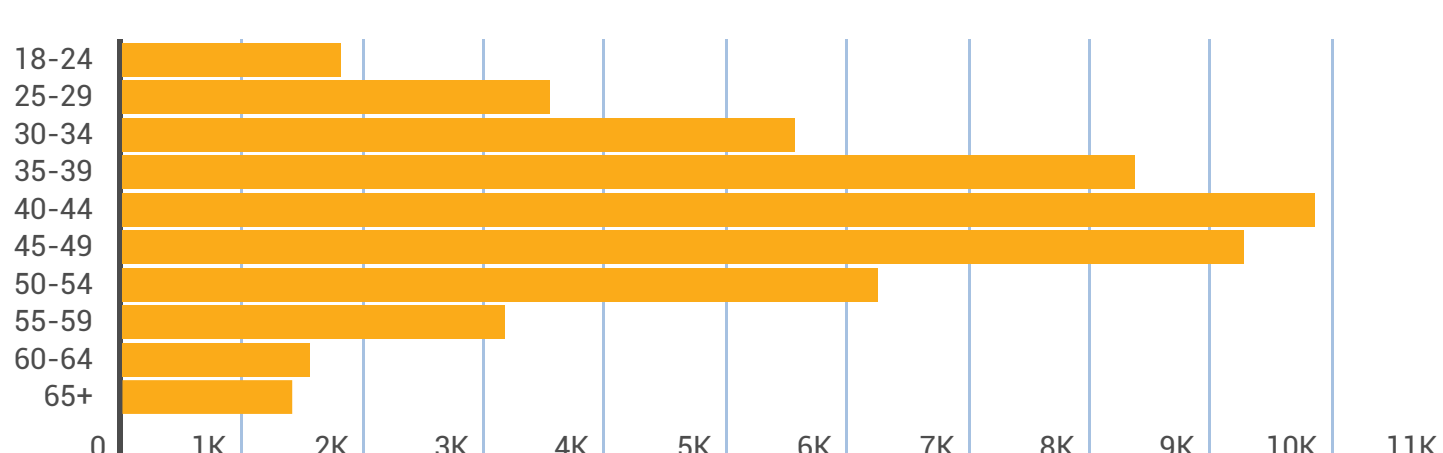
Family Size of OWRF Recipients

82% of OWRF recipients had at least 1 dependent minor child

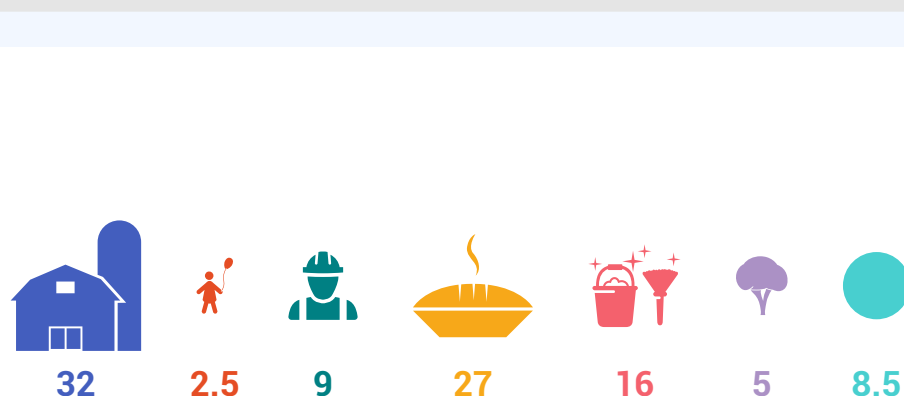
63% of OWRF recipients had at least 2 dependent minor children

Age Groups of OWRF Recipients

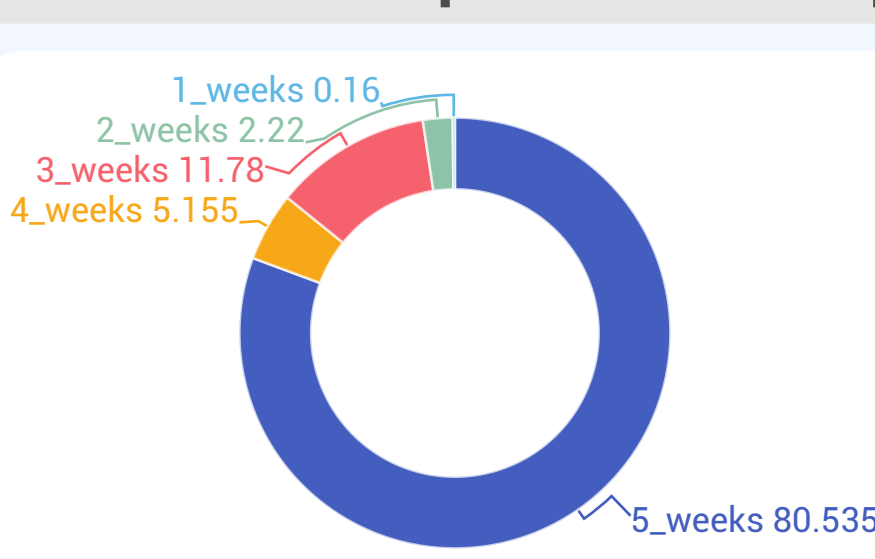


Employment Industry of OWRF Recipients

Weeks of Hardship of OWRF Recipients



At the time of applying for relief, **81% of applicants** indicated having **5 or more weeks of hardship** as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
